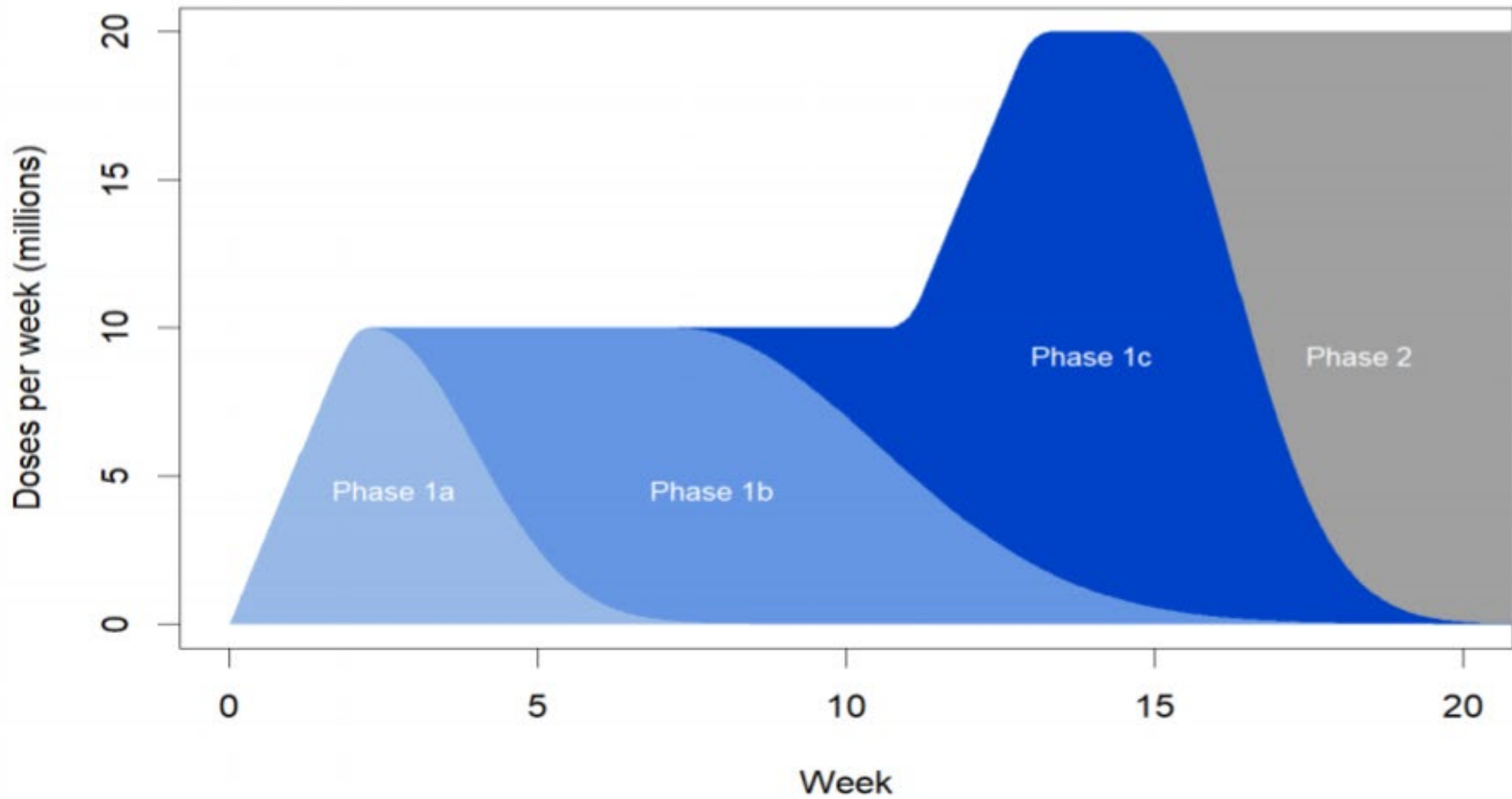
**GOAL: 70% OF MICHIGAN ADULTS WILL BE
VACCINATED BY THE END OF 2021**

CDC Vaccination Approval Process

- Vaccine moves through 3 phase process of development and human trials
- FDA authorizes or approves the vaccine (emergency use authorization)
- Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) holds public meeting to review data and vote on whether to recommend use, and if so, for who

Vaccine allocations within Michigan

- Pfizer Vaccine
 - EUA submitted on (11/20/20)
 - FDA/ACIP meeting 2nd week Dec, expect vaccinations to begin shortly after
 - Initial allocation to hospitals with ultra cold freezer
 - Future allocations to Federal LTC program and LHDs with ultra cold freezer
- Moderna Vaccine
 - EUA submitted on (11/30/20)
 - Expect vaccination before the end of the year
 - Broader distribution, less complex storage requirements
 - Allocations to LHDs for use on 1A populations (EMS), smaller hospitals, outpatient setting

Logistics of Vaccination Efforts

- Storage and management of the vaccine
- Retain social distancing during vaccination events
- Reporting and tracking vaccination in Michigan Care Improvement Registry
- Uptake of vaccine
